

DRINKING WATER WARNING

***The City of Wayland - loss of pressure, and potential contamination may occur,
BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING***

Due to planned construction, a drop in pressure in the City of Wayland's water supply has occurred for a small section of the city, and bacterial contamination may occur in the water system. Bacteria are generally not harmful and are common throughout our environment. Proper measures will be followed.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and preparing food. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Continue using boiled or bottled water until further notice.

What happened? What is being done?

These precautionary actions are being taken due to the loss of water pressure in the water distribution system **due to the planned construction**. Whenever a water system loses pressure for any significant length of time, precautionary measures are recommended.

The City of Wayland and water staff will be taking other remedial actions such as flushing and collecting bacteriological samples from around the system. The samples will be collected to determine that the water quality meets the state drinking water standards. We will inform you when tests show no bacteria and you no longer need to boil your water. We **anticipate** the boil water notice will be lifted **July 28th**.

This boil water notice shall remain in effect until results from the sampling verify the water is safe to drink. Customers will be advised when the boil water advisory has been lifted.
